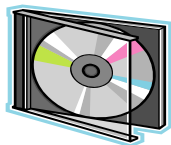

FROM THE DIRECTOR

Our library will be celebrating six years of service in our beautiful main library building on May 18. You have borrowed almost two million items in the last six years. Our Haverstraw Village branch in the historic Fowler Library building was totally renovated two years ago and is a welcoming place for the community. Both buildings are now busier than ever. Bad economic times like we have seen since the fall are always busy for public libraries, and Haverstraw King's Daughters is no exception.

We have job seekers using our internet terminals to search for employment, revise their resumes, and research companies and career possibilities. We see parents looking for financial information and scholarships for their children getting ready to apply to college. We have heard from new library users that they have stopped buying books, DVDs, and music, and have started to make the most of their tax dollars by checking out library materials. Our wide variety of programs for all ages have seen more attendance and we continue to offer programs which meet your academic, cultural, and entertainment needs.

The Board of Trustees and I have worked diligently on the 2009-10 library budget, which is presented in this newsletter. Our goals were to maintain services which are used by our community and preserve jobs. We have made reductions wherever possible to limit costs without compromising the services we offer you. Please review the information found in the budget section of the newsletter, and note the dates of our budget information sessions. We look forward to seeing you at these meetings.

JUNE 4 BUDGET VOTE AND TRUSTEE ELECTION

The library's annual budget vote and trustee election is on **Thursday, June 4**, from 10 am to 8 pm at the Village Branch and at the Main Library in the Rosman Center. **Voter Registration** is on Sat., **May 30**, 10:30 am-2:30 pm, at Rosman. **Public Information Sessions** are scheduled for Tuesday, **May 12**, 8 pm at Rosman, and Thursday, **May 14**, 8 pm in the Village. Trustee Stephen Cobb is running for reelection to a 5-year term. Petitions to run for Trustee and absentee ballot applications are available starting April 20th.

If you wish to run for Trustee, you must be a resident of the Haverstraw King's Daughters Public Library District. Petitions must be returned to the library by May 5. 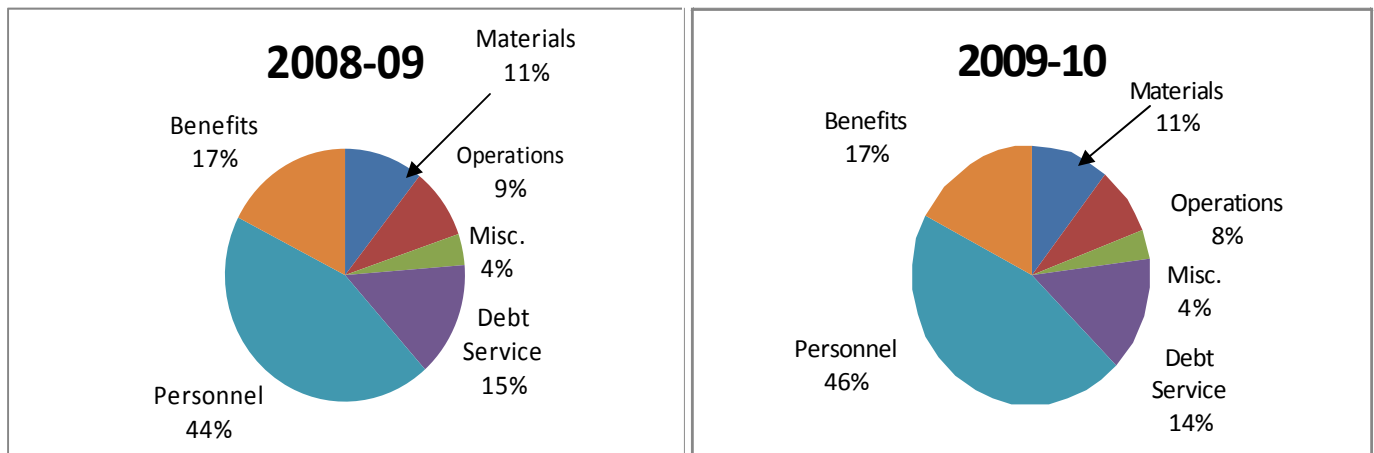

Your neighbors who serve as trustees thank you for your continued support.

This proposed budget reflects the current tax environment and The Board of Trustees' work to keep costs down, save jobs, and provide services. The budget includes cost savings in operations and miscellaneous expenses. There are no new staff positions. The library has contractual agreements for personnel. Several items in the materials and personnel categories are specific projects which will be paid for by the fund balance. The library has increased its revenue through interest yields, fines and fees, and discount programs.

The historic branch building exterior brick was re-pointed and new storm windows were added to help conserve energy. This project was partially funded by a \$36, 140 New York State Construction Grant and funds committed from the capital projects budget.

The library received permission from the NYS Commissioner of Education to limit the number of items borrowed by cardholders from two of our neighboring libraries. This has afforded our taxpayers quicker access to our new library materials.

Statistical highlights from our State Annual Report:

- 226,976 items in our collection
- 29,073 items were added during 2008
- 1081 programs were conducted
- 26, 384 library users attended programs
- 312,110 visits were made to the library
- 49,110 sessions were held on public internet stations

In the coming fiscal year our staff will continue to be available to give you professional, courteous service and provide the informational, technological, and leisure entertainment services our taxpayers deserve. We hope we can count on you to help us continue to provide excellence in library service.

Why Borrow A Playaway?

Talk about versatile and easy to use! A Playaway is a preloaded audio player, about the size of a deck of cards. We buy them with fiction and non-fiction titles. Our collection includes classics and current bestselling authors, language learning programs, and yoga practice. All you need to do is put in a AAA battery, plug in your headphones, press a button, and you're good to go! And there are ways you can listen to a Playaway in your car - Best Buy, Radio Shack, and similar retailers sell wireless FM transmitters starting at about \$20. These allow you to listen with a headphone jack through your car's radio. If your car has a cassette player you can purchase a cassette adapter for about \$15, which allows you to listen. If your car is new you may have a place to plug in a direct connect cable. So come in and ask us about our Playaways - they're in the lobby and we'd love to show them to you!

Laptops Available for Use In The Library
