## 2010-2011 Library Budget Approved

The Haverstraw King's Daughters Public Library budget was approved by the voters on Thursday, June 3 by a vote of 184 yes to 103 no. On behalf of the Board of Trustees and staff, we want to thank you, our community, for your continued support for library service in Haverstraw. The library budget for 2010-2011 is **\$5,081,306**. Library Trustees Gail Kaiser and Sonia Burgos Crannage were reelected to the Board for five-year and three year terms, respectively. Currently serving on the Board are: Richard Freeman, Patricia Soto, Karen Weaver, Gail Kaiser, Stephen Cobb, Bernadette Koop, and Sonia Burgos Crannage. Election of new officers will be held at the July meeting. These Board members serve as volunteers. We were pleased to assist first-time voter Conor Mallon from Garnerville. Conor recently turned 18 and registered to vote at the high school. Our library budget vote was his first opportunity to do his civic duty.

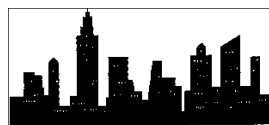

**Personal Library Introductions**



No, it's not a new dating service...come in and get an introduction to our online catalog, to our subscription databases or just to our collection generally. Part of making your library card the smartest card in your wallet is knowing how to use it. Stop in any weekday afternoon during the summer between 2 and 3 pm, or any weekday evening between 7 and 8 pm, and an Adult Services librarian will be glad to show you how to use the resources that your tax dollars enable us to offer. Think how smart you will look to your children when school starts and you can show them how to access the Library's resources from home!

**Public Internet Access at HKDPL**



In order to make our public computers available to the greatest number of patrons, our EnvisionWare software assigns each patron to a specific computer for one hour. If the computers are not being used heavily we can extend your time, in 15 or 20-minute increments, up to a second hour. The reason for doing it this way is so that a patron arriving in the building will not find that all the computers are in use, with no chance of getting on for an hour. Please be considerate of your fellow library users, and remember to request an extension BEFORE your session closes, as afterward we will not be able to get you back on. Keep in mind that there are more computers available in the mid-level computer center, so your chances of being able to get an extension may be better there than on the entry level. Also, be sure to remove any personal property from the computer areas, including headphones and flash drives.

**Accelerate Your Career!!**

On July 15 at 2 pm, come find out about the Library's online job search tool. Aggregating listings from a wide range of sources, the Job & Career Accelerator gives you tools to build and store resumes and cover letters, search for job listings, and organize your job search process. It also links you to our Learning Express Library, offering civil service and other test prep, as well as basic career skills refreshers. 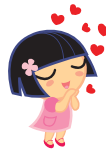

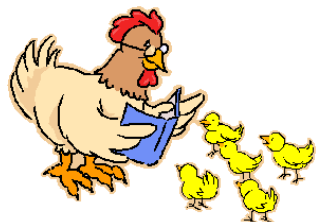

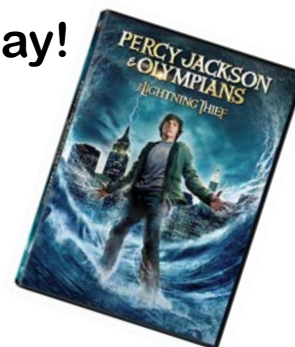
