## VILLAGE LIBRARY RENOVATION UPDATE



The historic village library building closed on July 1 to begin the preparation for the interior renovation. Staff has been packing up library materials. The collection has been weeded and donations of materials have been given to local schools and public libraries that suffered flood damage this summer. The popular Spanish collection and popular media have been temporarily moved to the main library so you continue to have access to these collections. The bid documents have been completed and the bid opening will have taken place after the printing of this newsletter. Carpets, flooring, lighting and paint colors have been selected. The library will be applying to New York State for library construction funds. We are also researching other possible grant opportunities.

We greatly appreciate your patience during the next several months. The wait will be worth it!

### *Good News For Spanish Speaking Adults and Children!*

Hundreds of books and other items in Spanish are now available in the HKDPL main building at Rosman Center. Audios and videos for learning English as a second language are included. For the convenience of our patrons, these materials have been transferred temporarily while the Village Library is being renovated. Most may be checked out with a library card, others are for use in the library only. Please ask at the Adult or Youth Services Reference Desk, and we will show you where Spanish materials can be found. Our Literacy Collection, for adult new readers, is now permanently housed at the main building at Rosman Center, for the use of tutors and their students.

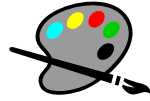

## Your Library - Still The Best Value In The Neighborhood!

### Changes In Fines



Just a reminder that your library card and use of all library materials are completely free if you return what you borrow on or before the date due. Our four county library system's policy is that once you owe \$3 you may not borrow anything more, and many libraries enforce this strictly, both for their own patrons and patrons of other libraries. We are generally reluctant to say no to you so we have often stretched the limit for our own cardholders, but we find that too many patrons owe significant amounts and continue to borrow materials without making more than a token payment.

Starting **October 1, 2006**, any individual owing more than \$3 in extended use fees or lost material charges will be unable to borrow anything else from HKDPL. You may still use the computers at the Library, and you are always welcome to attend our programs.

For those who find themselves in this situation, we would like to suggest a solution that benefits all of us and the community at large. From September 5 to September 10 we will be accepting donations of unopened canned or boxed food items. For each item, we will clear \$1 off your record, with a maximum limit of \$5. Please feel free to contribute a can or a box even if you don't owe us anything. All food collected will be donated to a local food pantry.

### Technology Notes

Thank you to all of you who are remembering to bring your library cards in order to access the Internet. Our new reservation software requires that you scan your barcode, so we hate to disappoint you when you come in without your card. Guest cards are available for those who do not live in the RCLS service area, but our patrons and those of other libraries in the system **MUST** have their cards with them.

## The Art of Censorship

Joe Raiola, Senior Editor of MAD Magazine will talk on “**The Art of Censorship**” on Thursday, September 28 at the Nanuet Public Library at 7:30 pm. The program is sponsored by the *Library Association of Rockland County* in recognition of Banned Books week, September 24 through October 1.

Observed since 1982, this annual event reminds Americans not to take this precious democratic freedom for granted. Banned Books Week celebrates the freedom to choose or the freedom to express one’s opinion even if that opinion might be considered unorthodox or unpopular, *and* stresses the importance of ensuring the availability of those unorthodox or unpopular viewpoints to all who wish to read them. After all, intellectual freedom can exist only where these two essential conditions are met.

For over 25 years, Joe Raiola has been performing his unique brand of biting social satire and autobiographical humor. His controversial one-man show, “Almost Obscene”, was the hit of the 2002 NYC International Fringe Festival and hailed by the New York Times as “a ruefully amusing lament for the ineradicable hypocrisy of humanity.” Joe’s professional comedy writing career began in 1984 when he teamed up with National Lampoon alumni for a series of classic magazine spoofs, including *Cosmoparody*, *Penthouse Parody*, and *Like A Rolling Stone*.

The following year he joined the legendary “Usual Gang of Idiots” at *MAD Magazine*, quickly becoming one of their most prized contributors, churning out irreverent satire, ad parodies, and inspired silliness.

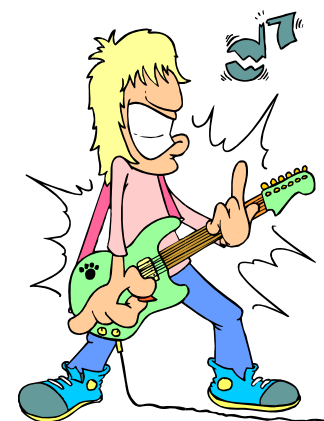
