## VILLAGE LIBRARY REOPENS



The newly renovated Village branch library opened Monday, June 18 at noon. The library had been closed since July, 2006. The interior has been redesigned and all furnishings and fixtures have been replaced. The exterior stairs and front walkway have been replaced.

The branch will serve the community as a popular materials branch. All popular materials including DVDs, CDs, bestsellers, magazines, and internet terminals are conveniently located on the first floor. The second floor will hold the fiction/non-fiction collection. All Adult and Youth materials will be filed together. A new program room/quiet study room is

located on the main floor.

We are still in the process of unpacking and shelving the general collection on the second level. Due to the delay the second floor is not yet available. The library will schedule a grand reopening celebration in the fall.

The Board of Trustees and staff greatly appreciate your patience these many months without the branch services. We know you will be pleased with the results. The branch hours are: Monday, noon to 8 pm; Tuesday through Thursday, 10 am to 6 pm; Friday, 10 am to 5:30 pm; Saturday, 10 am to 5 pm.
