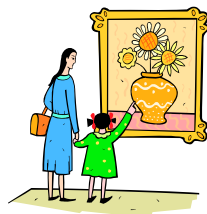

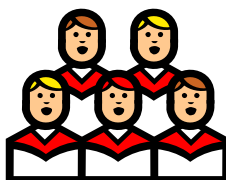

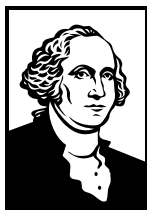

FROM THE DIRECTOR

.As the economy continues to suffer our library becomes busier. Your hard-earned library tax dollars are being used to provide resources to more residents of our library district. We offer many ways to save in this weak economy. Please take advantage of our programs and resources including our knowledgeable professional staff.

We are currently working with the Ramapo Catskill Library System to ensure that our cooperative arrangements with neighboring libraries are fair and that our resources are not monopolized by non-residents. More information on these "Direct Access Issues" will be spelled out after the New Year.

As part of our operations plan we are in the process of upgrading all public computers. The new computers are faster, equipped with more software, and have upgraded security. If you are not yet comfortable using a computer or the Internet we continue to provide introductory classes.

Please note on your calendar that the library will open at 1:00 PM on Tuesday, December 2 so that the staff can attend a security workshop. A nationally-recognized Library security expert will comment on our current security policies and operations, and conduct staff training. This workshop is necessary both to protect your library's materials and to ensure that your visits to the library are without incident.

Don't forget to vote on Tuesday, November 4. Since the main library is a polling place, we will open our doors at 6:00 AM, and we will have staff available so you may check out library materials even if you come in to vote before our normal 10:00 AM opening.

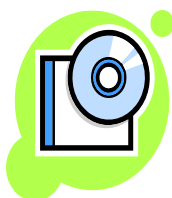

TECH NEWS



The New Face of Computing

Have you noticed the new look in Technology? After using the same computers

for 5 years, we have finally implemented our system upgrades. The new 22" Averatec All-in-One systems are loaded with new features and up-to-date programs to meet your needs. These are currently in the mid-level Computer Center, Teen, and Adult Reference areas. The next phase of upgrades will include the Youth Services area. Available software includes: Office 2007, Office 2007 Multilingual (Chinese, French, German, Hindi, Italian, Spanish, Hebrew, Portuguese, Russian, Serbian, Slovenian, and Turkish), Bridge to English (an ESL program), Art Explosion (with over 600,000 images), Toon Boom Studio, Manga Studio, Anime Studio, Adobe CS3 (Photoshop, Flash, Illustrator, Dreamweaver, InDesign, and Acrobat Professional), Smart Draw, Mavis Beacon Teaches Typing, Pantone for Fashion and Home Color Chooser, Just My Chemical Reaction, and Style Ease for MLA (and for APA). In the near future we will be adding more software which will be helpful to our younger patrons, such as Algebra Booster, Algebra 2, Middle School Advantage (already on the Village Library computers), Como Funcionan Las Cosas, Jump Start Typing, Jump Start Art, Chemistry Plus, Biology Plus, and several other grade-level programs. In addition to the new software, several Wacom Graphire Tablets (a device that connects to the USB port of the computer, and uses a pressure-sensitive pen to allow you to sketch, add a note to an

e-mail, edit photos, or simply sign your name) are available at the Reference and computer assistant desks for in-house use. These Tablets are compatible with both PCs and Macs, and allow you to import your sketches into your documents.

If you are new to the Microsoft Vista operating system, now is the time to try it. As we mentioned in our last newsletter, the new computers are not equipped with floppy disk drives. We will maintain some of the older computers which are. However, we have several other storage devices available at the reference desks. We advise that you save any work that you do on our computers to CDs, DVDs or flash/thumb drives. A 512MB drive sells for \$8, 1GB is \$12 and a 2GB flash drive is \$15. Simple instructions for using Office 2007, Manga, and the Graphire Tablet are also available at the service desks.
